Transportation of Children by Staff in Private Vehicles

At All Saints Infant and Nursery School and Selston Infant and Nursery School we do not facilitate the transportation of children in private vehicles for school visits or out of school activities.

However, if a child requires emergency transportation during school hours, e.g. to Urgent Care, then the school will facilitate this on the following basis:

- a. The transportation will be in the vehicle of a senior member of staff with appropriate business insurance.
- b. The school will take regular copies of these members of staff driving licences to ensure they are clean, check their business insurance annually and if required, retain copies of MOT certificates.
- c. These staff will transport the child if parents/carers are in excess of 30 minutes away and the child needs medical attention which is not deemed serious enough to require an ambulance. This assessment will be made in conjunction with school staff who are first aid trained.
- d. Two members of staff will travel with the child.
- e. At least one member of staff will take a mobile phone.
- f. Children will not travel in the front of the car.
- g. If under 135cms the child will be provided with a booster seat.
- h. If it is felt that the child being transported cannot be driven safely in this way, for whatever reason, then the school will wait for a parent / carer to arrive. If the injury is extremely serious, an ambulance will be called.
